1.0 OBJECTIVE

To provide a procedure to manage the Community Member Recognition Awards Program as outlined in Policy P.013.GOV: Community Member Recognition Awards Program.

2.0 DEFINITIONS

In this procedure,

- 2.1 Community Member Recognition Awards Selection Committee refers to the ad hoc committee established annually for purposes of administering the Community Member Recognition Awards Program.
- 2.2 **Advisory Committee on the Arts** refers to the Board's outside Advisory Committee with responsibility for advising on the Arts. It is responsible for administering the Community Award for the Arts.

3.0 RESPONSIBILITY

3.1 The Director of Education, or designate.

4.0 PROCEDURES

- 4.1 The Director of Education, or designate, will issue a call for nominations for Community Member Recognition Awards annually through the appropriate normal channels, as described in Attachment A. Each nomination form (electronic form or Attachment B) must provide the names of the three eligible nominators for the application to be considered by the Awards Selection Committee.
- 4.2 Unless otherwise specified in Attachment A, nominations may be made by trustees, school councils, Ottawa-Carleton Assembly of School Councils (OCASC), Parent Involvement Committee, Principals, OCDSB staff and community members.
- 4.3 The call for nominations will clearly specify the deadline for submission of nomination forms, normally two months prior to the presentation date.

- 4.4 Employees of the District are not eligible for nomination for the following awards:
 - a) Community Award;
 - b) Distinguished School Council Service Award;
 - c) Volunteer of the Year Award;
 - d) Community Partnership Award; or
 - e) Excellence in Equity Community Award.
- 4.5 The award recipients, with the exception of the Student Recognition Awards, the Excellence in Equity Student Award, and the Community Award for the Arts, will be selected by the Chair of the Board (Chair's Award) or the Community Member Recognition Awards Selection Committee, as outlined in Attachment A, using the specified criteria.
- 4.6 Unless otherwise specified, one recipient will be selected for each award.
- 4.7 In the event that there are a significant number of nominees in any particular award category, the Community Member Recognition Awards Selection Committee may create a list of finalists from which the recipient is selected.
- 4.8 The decision of the Chair or the Community Member Recognition Awards Selection Committee, as appropriate, will be final.
- 4.9 Recipients of all awards will be notified in writing that they have been selected, and will be publicly acknowledged and celebrated at a formal awards ceremony to be held prior to a regularly scheduled Board meeting each spring, or at a special event organized for this purpose.
- 4.10 The Communications department will promote the awards process and publicly acknowledge the recipients of all awards.

Distinguished School Council Service Award:

In recognition of the outstanding efforts of a school council or school council member for making a significant contribution to enhancing the learning experience of students at a school and/or system level.

Volunteer of the Year Award:

In recognition of the substantial contribution of a parent volunteer or community volunteer over an extended period of years or through a single significant initiative that has had a positive impact on students. OCDSB employees or those who are paid for their services are not eligible to be nominated in this category.

Community Partnership Award:

In recognition of outstanding partnership/support from a community agency or business over an extended period of years or through a significant initiative that has directly benefited OCDSB students.

Excellence in Equity Community Award (in tribute to Isis Officer):

Demonstration of innovative and creative initiatives to achieve a positive, safe and inclusive outcome by a secondary school student or team in a secondary school and/or alternative site.

Student Recognition Awards:

Demonstration of personal initiative to achieve a positive outcome by a secondary school student in each secondary school/alternate site.

Community Award for the Arts (Advisory Committee on the Arts):

For exceptional community contributions to arts education during the current year. This award is meant for a community volunteer, individual or group.
